ComReg issues revised Radio Frequency Plan for Ireland

The Commission for Communications Regulation (ComReg) has today issued a revised version of its Radio Frequency Plan for Ireland. This plan details the types of radio services that are permitted for operation in Ireland and is a vital source of information for consumers, licensees, manufacturers and operators who wish to use the radio spectrum.

The radio spectrum is a valuable resource that plays an important role in the development of Ireland's economy. ComReg's Radio Frequency Plan provides a framework for the efficient management and use of the radio spectrum in Ireland and facilitates the introduction of innovative new radio services essential to the continued economic and social development of Ireland.

This revised Plan incorporates changes to the radio frequency allocations that have been made at both national and international level.

The dynamic nature of the communications sector requires ComReg to review this Plan at regular intervals. ComReg intends to publish new editions of this Radio Frequency Plan as and when necessary.
