ComReg launches public consultation on the regulation of .ie

The Commission for Communications Regulation (ComReg) has initiated a public consultation on the regulation of the .ie domain.

Under the 2007 Communications Regulation (Amendment) Act 2007, ComReg has been given responsibility to make regulations affecting the management and administration of that part of the global Domain Name System assigned to Ireland, the .ie country code Top Level Domain (ccTLD) in the best interests of Irish consumers using this national resource.

ComReg is considering what steps it now needs to take and has launched a public consultation on regulation in relation to this matter. This consultation with all interested parties presents ComReg's preliminary position and seeks the views of those parties. The consultation will close on 8 August 2008.
