Under Section 13 of the Communications Regulation Acts 2002 to 2011 ('the Act')<sup>1</sup>, the Commission for Communications Regulation ('ComReg') may at any time, by notice in writing, require an undertaking to provide it with such written information as it considers necessary to enable it to carry out its functions.

ComReg opened an investigation on 14 September 2016 after Vodafone Ireland ('Vodafone') did not provide the information which it was required to provide to ComReg by 9 September 2016 as part of ComReg's analysis of the market for Fixed Voice Call Termination ("Market 1"). Following the investigation, ComReg has today given a Notice of Intention to Prosecute to Vodafone, pursuant to Section 44 of the Act in respect of the alleged offence.

If, within 21 days of the date on which this notice is given, Vodafone, as far as is practicable, remedies to the satisfaction of the Commission the matter giving rise to the alleged offence and pays to the Commission €1,500, accompanied by this notice, Vodafone will not be prosecuted for the alleged offence.

ComReg will continue to monitor the compliance of other operators with Section 13(D) and will take appropriate action as necessary.
