## **Irish Telephony Numbering Scheme Status Report - October 2002**

## 1. About this Document

This document lists the current designation or allocation status of the Irish telephony numbering scheme in summary form. It updates and replaces the previous version of this document - ODTR 00/50, issued in July 2000. It takes account of ODTR Decision Notices D1/99, D2/99 and D11/01 (document numbers ODTR 99/24, ODTR 99/29 and ODTR 01/58 respectively). In addition the document also takes account of designations that have occurred since the release of ODTR 00/50.

The number of Minimum Numbering Areas (MNAs) is being reduced from 128 to 106 coincident with the publication of the Directories in 2002, the last of which will be published on the 10<sup>th</sup> October<sup>1</sup>. This document takes full account of the reduction in the number of MNAs.

## 2. The Numbering Scheme

The Irish telephony numbering scheme is made up of all numbers which may be dialled on a public telecommunications network in Ireland and which are used to establish telephone calls. The telephony-numbering scheme is managed and administered by the Director of Telecommunications Regulation as a public resource on behalf of the State.

## 3. Contents of This Document

The Director is required under the telecommunications ONP regulations<sup>2</sup>, and the telecommunications Interconnection regulations<sup>3</sup> to publish the main elements of the numbering scheme. This document lists in summary form the purposes for which different numbers have been designated. The information relates only to access codes or short numbers for the first five digits dialled. Subscriber numbers and numbers which contain additional characters, such as \* and #, are not included. More detailed information about segments of the numbering scheme is available on the ODTR web site at <http://www.odtr.ie>, or within the National Numbering Conventions, ODTR doc.01/94.

The status of each number is correct on the date this document is issued. The numbering scheme changes on an ongoing basis and changes that occur after the issue date will be reflected in future versions of this document.

## 4. Conditions of Allocation

This document is for information purposes only; conditions that apply to designations or allocations are not shown. No entitlement to the use of any access code or subscriber number shall accrue as a result of the issue of this document, whether or not that code or number is included in this document.

## 5. Emergency Services

Two short numbers (112 and 999) have been designated to provide access to State Emergency Services. Both numbers provide connection to the same service, however 112 represents a harmonised emergency number in use throughout the European Union.

## 6. Explanation of Tables

*Code* can mean an access code which would be followed by a subscriber number (e.g. 021 for Cork), or a complete short number (e.g. 118XX for Directory Enquiries). The codes listed vary in length from 2 to 5 digits.

*Status* A means the code has been allocated or designated for a specific purpose.

R means the code is reserved for a specific purpose, but is not in use.

C means the code is currently in use but subject to change. The change may be a full recovery of the access code or a change to the subscriber number.

Where numbers are changing, the date for the change is also provided. This is the date at which parallel running for these numbers ends.

Free means the code is not in use, and is available for future allocation or designation.

*Subscriber No. Length* Where two figures are shown, with an asterisk against the second, this represents an imminent or ongoing change.
