Revised Amendments to ComReg Document 08/90R, “Radio Frequency Plan for Ireland”.

Since updating the Radio Frequency Plan (ComReg Document 08/90R) in December 2010, there have been a number of new and amended National and European standards which have been implemented within Ireland. ComReg has updated the Radio Frequency Plan to reflect these changes, as outlined below.

Radio Frequency Plan Amendments (19 December 2011 Revision)

In order to reflect the implementation of applicable National and European Decisions, Recommendations, and Standards within Ireland, the following references have been included in the relevant sections of the Radio Frequency Plan:

- S.I. 189 of 2011 - "Wireless telegraphy (interim GSM mobile telephony licence) regulations 2011".
- S.I. 195 of 2010 – “European Communities (public pan-European cellular digital land-based mobile communications) regulations 2010”.
- 2011/829/EU – “ Commission Decision of 8 December 2011, amending Decision 2006/771/EC on harmonisation of the radio spectrum for use by short-range devices”
- 2011/251/EU– “Commission implementing Decision of 18 April 2011 amending Decision 2009/766/EC on the harmonisation of the 900 MHz and 1800 MHz frequency bands for terrestrial systems capable of providing pan-European electronic communications services in the Community”.
- 2011/485/EU – “Commission Decision 2011/485/EU amending Decision 2005/50/EC of 17 January 2005 on the harmonisation of the 24 GHz range radio spectrum band for the time-limited use by automotive short-range radar equipment in the Community”.
- ECC/DEC/(11)03 – “ECC Decision of 24 June 2011 on the harmonised use of frequencies for Citizens' Band (CB) radio equipment” .

General

It should be noted that the Radio Frequency Plan for Ireland is regularly updated to facilitate the introduction of new radio services and to remove allocations for radio services that have been phased out. Amendments are also be made to align the document to any new international agreements reached on spectrum utilisation e.g. at World Radiocommunication Conferences (WRCs) of the ITU or within CEPT or the European Union
