Telecoms Regulator proposes amendments to Chorus, Esat BT and *eircom*'s Wireless Broadband Licences

The Telecoms Regulator, **Etain Doyle**, today announced details of proposed changes to the FWA broadband licences* held by *eircom* ltd, Esat BT and Chorus. The proposals are being made to take account of technological advances, to allow for swapping of named sites and/or counties and to sanction substantial non-compliance with licence obligations.

The proposed amendments include:

- Removal of certain licence obligations from *eircom* regarding antennae sites and the provision of the Centrex service.
- Relocation of base stations at Mullingar, Tullamore, Naas, and also Ennis to alternative sites in the Esat FWPMA Licence.
- Revocation of Chorus's FWPMA broadband licence*

Interested parties have 21 days to make representations to Etain Doyle in relation to the proposals.

The Regulator has noted that a new scheme to allow for local area FWA licensing on a first come first served basis is currently being devised. This scheme will be open to all operators requiring spectrum for wireless broadband services.
